Alternate Financial Aid Resources

While the federal government is the primary source of educational funding in the U.S., other resources exist. Some other areas to investigate for school funding include the following.

- Religious, Social, and Professional Organizations: If a student is a member of a religious organization such as a church, synagogue, or mosque; a community organization (Rotary Club, Elks, Moose, etc.); or has been a member of a professional organization (APA, ABA, AMA, etc.), they should inquire about the availability of any educational assistance programs and the award criteria.
- **Employers:** Some companies offer tuition <u>reimbursement</u> for employees. Students are encouraged to consult their employer's human resources or benefits office to see what programs might be available.
